**RESOLVE, in Favor of Maine Society of the Sons of the American
Revolution.**

Maine Society of the Sons of the American Revolution; appropriation. Resolved: There is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$200 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1962 for the purpose of procuring testimonials to be used in marking the unmarked graves of the soldiers of the Revolutionary War; and be it further

Resolved: That with the approval of the Governor and Council, said sum shall be paid into the treasury of the "Maine Society of the Sons of the American Revolution," with which they are authorized to procure and distribute such number of markers as may, from time to time, be required for the purposes herein specified.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

This money is used for the expense of markers for soldiers' graves. There are some 1,500 of known locations in the State of Maine.
