**AN ACT Dividing Township of Freeman, Franklin County, for Voting
Purposes.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Township of Freeman divided for voting purposes. The Township of Freeman in Franklin County shall be divided by drawing a line on the face of the earth separating the township politically as follows:

To locate point of beginning, start at the northeast corner of the Township of Freeman where it intersects the northwest corner of the Town of New Portland, thence south following the Somerset-Franklin County line a distance of 175.5 chains; thence west still following the Somerset-Franklin County line a distance of 36 chains. This is the point of beginning. Thence at an azimuth of 295 degrees for a distance of 238.5 chains to the junction of routes 142 and 145, a point known as Knockwood Corner.

Those living to the north of described line shall vote for all national, state, county and legislative issues in the voting place in Kingfield. Those living to the south of described line shall vote for all national, state, county and legislative issues in the voting place in Strong.
