STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SIXTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Facilities at Picnic Grounds.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 23, § 27, amended. Section 27 of chapter 23 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding at the end the following paragraph:

'Any such project to be constructed shall be located near suitably clean drinking water. Any such project already constructed or to be constructed shall be provided with a toilet and a covered trash barrel.'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 36, § 16-A, additional. Chapter 36 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 16-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 16-A. Camp grounds; picnic areas. Any picnic area, lunch ground or camping ground which may be constructed by the Forestry Department shall be located near suitably clean drinking water. Any such project already constructed or to be constructed shall be provided with a toilet and a covered trash barrel.'

Sec. 3. R. S., c. 36, § 34, sub-§ VI-B, additional. Section 34 of chapter 36 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended by adding a new subsection VI-B, as follows:

'VI-B. Camp grounds; picnic areas. To locate any picnic area, lunch ground or camping ground near suitably clean drinking water and to provide any such project already constructed or to be constructed with a toilet and a covered trash barrel.'
