STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Examination of Alleged Insane Criminals before Municipal Courts.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 146, § 3-A, additional. Chapter 146 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 3-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 3-A. Examination of alleged insane criminals. A municipal court judge may, on his own motion or on motion of the county attorney that a person accused of an offense is insane, order such person examined by a reputable physician or the superintendent of either of the state hospitals for the mentally ill to determine the truth or falsity of the alleged insanity.'
