AN ACT Relating to Use of Live Bait in Little Sebago Lake, Cumberland County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 37, § 63, amended. The first paragraph of section 63 of chapter 37 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, is amended to read as follows:

'It shall be unlawful to sell, use or have in possession, either dead or alive, for use as bait for fishing in the inland waters of this State any pickerel, goldfish, yellow perch, white perch, bass, sunfish, crappie, hornpout, carp or any spiny-finned fish; **except that the use or possession of live bait, including yellow perch which have been caught at Little Sebago Lake, Cumberland County, the same day as used, shall be permitted in said Little Sebago Lake.**'
