STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Powers of Commissioner of Labor and Industry Under Minimum Wage Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 30, § 132-H, sub-§ I, amended. The first sentence of subsection I of section 132-H of chapter 30 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by chapter 362 of the public laws of 1959, is amended to read as follows:

'The commissioner or his authorized representative, upon written complaint setting forth the violation of section 132-C shall have authority to enter the place of business or employment of any employer or employees in the State, as defined in section 132-B, for the purpose of examining and inspecting any or all books, registers, payrolls and other records of any such employer that in any way relate to or have a bearing upon the question of wages, hours and other conditions of employment of any such employees; copy any or all of such books, registers, payrolls and other records as he or his authorized representative may deem necessary or appropriate; and question such employees in the presence of the employer or his authorized agent for the purpose of ascertaining whether sections 132-A to 132-J have been and are being complied with.'
