STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Signals at Railroad Crossings.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 96, § 48, amended. The 2nd sentence of section 48 of chapter 96 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter 96 of the public laws of 1959, is further amended to read as follows:

'Said Public Utilities Commission shall have the right to refuse its said permission or to grant the same upon such terms and conditions as it may prescribe, including the manner and conditions in accordance with which the way may cross such track or land or right-of-way of any railroad corporation and the need, if any, for installation, maintenance and operation of flashing light signals or other protective measures to secure human life, and may determine whether the expense of building and maintaining so much of said way as is within the limits of such railroad corporation and whether the cost of installation, maintenance and operation of any flashing light signals or other protection required by it shall be borne by such railroad corporation, or by the city or town in which such way or flashing light signal or other protection is located, or by the State, or said Public Utilities Commission may apportion such expense between such railroad corporation and the city, town or State.'
