STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Formation of School Administrative Districts for Certain Towns in York County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Formation of School Administrative Districts for certain towns. The School District Commission, established under the Revised Statutes, chapter 41, may approve the formation of a school administrative district composed of all or any of the Towns of Acton, Alfred, Limerick, Lyman, Newfield, Shapleigh and Waterboro if such district had not less than 50 resident secondary pupils educated at public expense in grades 9 through 12 as indicated in the last return to the Commissioner of Education under the Revised Statutes, chapter 41, section 71, provided that on the date of the approval there was on file with the commission a contract offer duly authorized and executed running to the proposed school administrative district from a municipality having 100 or more resident pupils educated at public expense in grades 9 through 12 as indicated on the last return to the Commissioner of Education under said section 71, to take and educate all pupils in grades 9 through 12 or 10 through 12 in the proposed school administrative district for a period of from 5 to 20 years; and provided that in combination with the proposed school administrative district the total number of resident high school pupils to be educated in grades 9 through 12 exceeds 300.
