#### STATE OF MAINE

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE

AN ACT Relative to the Granting of Licenses for Certain Businesses and Purposes by the Municipal Officers of the Town of Old Orchard Beach.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. r. Municipal officers authorized to grant certain licenses. The municipal officers of the Town of Old Orchard Beach are authorized to grant licenses for the following businesses and purposes, in accordance with such rules and regulations not inconsistent with law, as the Town of said Old Orchard Beach may make, vote and establish by ordinance, and upon payment by the licensee of fees established by such ordinance not in excess of the schedule under section 3. Such licenses shall expire on the first day of May of each year, and no pro rate shall be allowed for any part-time license.
- **Sec. 2. Purpose.** The purpose of this act is intended to provide the municipal officers of the Town of Old Orchard Beach a reasonable medium for control of certain businesses and purposes and to provide a source of revenue through license fees and license taxes.

- Sec. 4. Suspension or revocation. Any license issued by the municipal officers of the Town of Old Orchard Beach under such ordinance may be suspended or revoked by the municipal officers upon hearing and for cause. The person to whom such license is issued shall have the right to appeal to the Superior Court and pending such appeal such license shall remain suspended. No refund of any part of a license fee shall be made in connection with the suspension or revocation of any license for cause.
- Sec. 5. Suspension or revocation cause. The term "cause" as used in section 4 shall include the doing or omitting doing of any act, or permitting any condition to exist in connection with any trade, profession, business or privilege for which a license is granted under the provisions of such ordinance, or any premises or facilities in connection therewith, which act, omission or condition is:
  - I. Contrary to the health, morals, safety or welfare of the public.
  - II. Unlawful, irregular or fraudulent in nature.
  - III. Unauthorized or beyond the scope of the license granted.
  - **IV.** Forbidden by the provisions of state law or town ordinances, or any duly established rule or regulation of the town applicable to the trade, profession, business, privilege, act or operation for which the license has been granted.
  - **V.** The result of failure to comply continuously with all conditions required as precedent to the approval of the license.
- Sec. 6. Severability. If any section or provision, or parts thereof, of this act shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity of the act as a whole or of any other section or provision or part hereof.
