RESOLVE, Providing for a Pension for Camille Dube of Plaisted.

Camille Dube; state pension. Resolved: That a pension of \$60 per month is granted to Camille Dube of Plaisted, to be paid monthly from the appropriation for special legislative pensions. Such pension shall begin on July 1, 1962 and continue until otherwise provided by the Legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Camille Dube is an amputee causing him to walk with crutches, he is 40 years of age, lives with his mother who received \$46.50 a month in social security payments. He has made many attempts to find employment, both in-State and out-of-State but due to his disability he has not been successful. It is obvious that his mother cannot support him and he feels that he should receive a pension from the State.
