RESOLVE, Appropriating Moneys for an Industrial Arts Building at Gorham State Teachers' College.

Gorham State Teachers' College; appropriation. Resolved: That there is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$681,300 to Gorham State Teachers' College to construct an industrial arts building for general metalwork, general electricity, general woodwork, transportation, general shop, graphic arts, general crafts, technical drawing, classrooms, administrative areas and storage facilities. Funds appropriated under this resolve shall be expended on recommendation of the State Board of Education and approved by the Governor and Council; and be it further

Resolved: That the moneys appropriated by this resolve shall not lapse, but shall remain a continuing carrying account until the purposes of this resolve have been accomplished.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Present facilities are inadequate, unsafe, antiquated and uneconomical, and are located in 4 separate buildings. The industrial arts building would provide modern, adequate classrooms, shops and auxiliary facilities. Gorham is the only college in Maine preparing teachers for industrial arts and vocational education.
