AN ACT Relating to Driving Deer by More Than Four Persons.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 37, § 92, amended. Section 92 of chapter 37 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, is amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 92. Horning or driving deer. It shall be unlawful to drive deer by use of horns, whistles or other noisemaking devices. It shall be unlawful for more than § 4 persons to participate in a joint hunt for deer, wherein an effort is made to drive deer.'
