STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Bonds of County Sheriffs.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 89, § 142, amended. The last sentence of section 142 of chapter 89 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

Every person elected or appointed sheriff for the Counties of York, Cumberland, Kennebec or Penobscot before receiving his commission shall give bond to the Treasurer of State with at least 3 sufficient sureties or with the bond of a surety company authorized to do business in this State as surety, in the sum of \$40,000-3, and for any of the other counties, in the sum of \$25,000, conditioned for the faithful performance of the duties of his office and to answer for all neglect and misdoings of his deputies.'
