STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE

AN ACT Regulating the Use of Horses and Bicycles on Ways.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 22, § 129-A, additional. Chapter 22 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended by adding a new section 129-A to read as follows:

'Sec. 129-A. Persons riding horses on ways. Every person riding a horse upon a roadway shall, except when making a right turn, ride said horse as near to the left side of the roadway as practicable, facing traffic which may approach from the opposite direction.'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 22, § 147-A, amended. The first paragraph of section 147-A of chapter 22 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by chapter 294 of the public laws of 1957, is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

'Every person operating a bicycle upon a roadway shall, except when making a right turn, ride said bicycle as near to the left side of the roadway as practicable, facing traffic which may approach from the opposite direction.'
