STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to the Towns' Share of the Cost of Aid to Dependent Children.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 25, § 243, amended. Section 243 of chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 243. Towns to be assessed. The State shall recover from the eity, town or plantation municipality in which the child so aided has legal settlement 18% 12% of the amount expended for aid to each dependent child from July 1, 1961 to June 30, 1963; 6% of the amount expended for aid to each dependent child from July 1, 1963 to June 30, 1965, which shall be credited to the regular legislative appropriation for aid to dependent children. Any amount expended for aid to dependent children after June 30, 1965 shall be from state and federal funds. Whenever it appears that a eity, town or plantation municipality is delinquent in making reimbursements to the State, the amounts shall be collected by the State in the same manner and subject to the same penalties as state taxes. Any balance due shall be assessed in the succeeding year in the same manner as other state taxes.'
