AN ACT Relating to Digging Clams in the Towns of Cushing, Friendship and  
Thomaston.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S., 1959, c. 155, § 49-A, additional. Chapter 155 of the private and special laws of 1959 is amended by adding a new section to be numbered 49-A, to read as follows:

‘Sec. 49-A. Digging clams in the Towns of Cushing, Friendship and Thomaston. It shall be unlawful for any person to dig any clams within the limits of the Towns of Cushing, Friendship and Thomaston, Knox County, except a person who is a resident of or is assessed and pays a real estate tax in any of the said towns.

The term “a resident” shall mean a person who has resided in this State for the term of at least 6 consecutive months, and in the Town of Cushing, Friendship or Thomaston for at least 3 months immediately prior to the date when a claim for such residence may be made.’
