RESOLVE, Appropriating Money to Supplement Federal Vocational Funds for Area Education Programs for Apprentices and Other Adult Workers.

Department of Education; appropriation. Resolved: That there is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$15,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1962 and the sum of \$15,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1963 to supplement present vocational funds in reimbursing local administrative units for classes of related instruction for apprentices or for classes of technical or related instruction for other adult workers when such classes enroll persons not residents of the area within the jurisdiction of the administrative unit sponsoring the class. Rates of reimbursement, established by the State Board of Education, will reimburse the local administrative unit partially or in full for expenditures made on account of nonresident students.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Classes of instruction for apprentices and for other adult workers are needed and can be provided most efficiently when they can serve a fairly large area. Under these conditions, local administrative school units are reluctant to conduct them if it will involve using locally appropriated funds to pay the expense of those students who do not reside within the area served by the local administrative unit. Organization of such classes will be greatly facilitated if the Department of Education can reimburse the local unit for the extra expense on account of nonresident persons enrolled.
