AN ACT Relating to Descriptive Signs Concerning School Buses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 22, § 48, amended. The 2nd paragraph of section 48 of chapter 22 of the Revised Statutes, as repealed and replaced by section 29 of chapter 429 of the public laws of 1957, is amended by adding at the end a new sentence to read as follows:

'Such descriptive signs on school buses operating in counties which border upon Canada shall be in French as well as English.'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 22, § 119, amended. Section 119 of chapter 22 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 2 of chapter 85 of the public laws of 1955, is amended by adding a new paragraph to read as follows:

'All signs along any highway which notify motor vehicle operators of the Maine law relating to school buses shall, in those counties which border upon Canada, be in French as well as English.'
