STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Disability Retirement Under Maine State Retirement Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 63-A, § 7, sub-§ I, ¶ A, amended. Paragraph A of subsection I of section 7 of chapter 63-A of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 417 of the public laws of 1955, is amended by adding at the end 2 new sentences to read as follows:

Except that any member who has had 10 or more years of creditable service, and has not attained age 60, and who has separated from service due to illness or injury may apply for a disability retirement allowance and may become entitled to such benefits if the medical board and the board of trustees are supplied with evidence that the cause of the disability originated while the member was in service. Benefits shall become effective no earlier than the date the board of trustees receives written notification of said disability.'
