STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Inspection of Schoolhouse Boilers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 30, § 72, amended. The 5th and 8th sentences of section 72 of chapter 30 of the Revised Statutes are amended to read as follows:

'Such inspection certificate shall be valid for not more than 14 months from its date for not more than the maximum period of time permitted by law to elapse between inspections and it shall be posted under glass in the engine or boiler room containing such boiler or an engine operated by it, or, in the case of portable boiler, in the office of the plant where it is located for the time being.'

'Not more than 14 months shall elapse between such inspections and there shall be at least 4 such inspections in 37 consecutive months, except that boilers located in schoolhouses which carry pressures not exceeding 15 pounds per square inch shall be inspected every 3 years.'
