STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Sale of Liquor on New Year's Eve and New Year's Day.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 61, § 27, amended. The first 2 sentences of section 27 of chapter 61 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, are further amended to read as follows:

'No liquor shall be sold in this State on Sundays except as otherwise provided and no licensee by himself, clerk, servant or agent shall between the hours of midnight and 6 A. M. sell or deliver any liquors, except no liquors shall be sold or delivered on Saturdays after 11:45 P. M. Liquor may be sold on January 1st of any year from midnight to 2 A. M. unless January 1st falls on Sunday December 31st of any year from 9 P. M. to midnight and on January 1st of any year from midnight to 2:00 A. M. even if December 31st or January first falls on Sunday; and after midnight no advertising signs, as enumerated in section 54, shall be electrically lighted.'
