# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE

## AN ACT Relating to Removal of Buildings Gutted by Fire or Debris Remaining after Building Destroyed by Fire.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., c. 97, § 22, amended.** The 2nd sentence of section 22 of chapter 97 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

'Whenever any of said officers shall find any building or other structure which, for want of repairs or by reason of age or dilapidated condition or from any other cause is especially liable to fire, and or which is so situated as to endanger other property or the safety of the public, and or whenever such officer shal find in or around any building combustible or explosive matter or inflammable or other conditions dangerous to the safety of such buildings, or whenever such officer shall find any building which has been gutted by fire, or whenever such officer shall find that debris remains from a building which has been destroyed by fire or otherwise, he shall order the same to be removed or remedied, and such order shall forthwith be complied with by the owner or occupant of such premises or building.'
