STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE

AN ACT Prohibiting Sale of Lobsters Taken by Skindivers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 37-A, § 66-A, additional. Chapter 37-A of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 331 of the public laws of 1959, is amended by adding a new section 66-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 66-A. Sale of lobsters taken by skindivers prohibited. It is unlawful for any person who fishes for, takes or catches lobsters, while submerged, to offer for sale or sell such lobsters.'
