STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Notification for Renewal of Operators' Licenses and Providing for a Two Year License.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 22, § 60, amended. The 3rd sentence of section 60 of chapter 22 of the Revised Statutes, as repealed and replaced by section 11 of chapter 363 of the public laws of 1959, is amended to read as follows:

'A fee of \$2 \$4 shall accompany the application.'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 22, § 60, amended. The 2nd paragraph of section 60 of chapter 22 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section I of chapter 121 of the public laws of 1957, is repealed as follows:

'All renewal licenses to operate motor vehicles issued after December 3+, 1958 shall expire annually at midnight on the anniversary of license holder's date of birth. The fee for such license shall be computed at the rate of 1/4 of such annual license fee per quarter or any fractional part thereof.'

Sec. 3. R. S., c. 22, § 60, amended. The 3rd paragraph of section 60 of chapter 22 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 2 of chapter 10 of the public laws of 1959, is further amended to read as follows:

'All new licenses to operate motor vehicles issued after December 31, 1958 shall expire at midnight on the license holder's second birthday next following the date of issuance of said license. The fee for such license shall be \$2 \$4.

This paragraph shall not apply to a person who is required to submit to an annual examination because of advanced age or physical disability and such

person shall be issued a license valid until he is required to submit to a reexamination.'

Sec. 4. R. S., c. 22, § 60, amended. Section 60 of chapter 22 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended by adding after the 3rd paragraph, a new paragraph to read as follows:

'The Secretary of State shall at least 14 days prior to the expiration of such licenses mail first class to such license holder an application of renewal of license, except that no notification shall be sent to those persons who are required to submit to an annual examination because of advanced age or physical disability.'

- Sec. 5. Appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Highway Fund to the Office of Secretary of State the sum of \$18,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1962 and \$5,500 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1963 to carry out the purposes of this act.
- Sec. 6. Effective date. This act shall be effective for the calendar year 1962 and for the subsequent years until changed by legislative enactment.
