AN ACT Regulating Certain Poultry Workers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 32, §§ 132-A to 132-C, additional. Chapter 32 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding 3 new sections 132-A to 132-C, to read as follows:

'Poultry Workers.

Sec. 132-A. Definition. "Poultry worker" means a person who performs such services for poultry as trucking, handling grain, picking up eggs, exterminating poultry pests or rendering other services under the supervision of a foreman qualified in poultry handling.

Sec. 132-B. License. No person shall act as a poultry worker without having first obtained an annual license from the Division of Animal Industry, the fee for which shall be \$2. Each poultry worker shall comply with such rules and regulations as the commissioner shall establish respecting poultry sanitation. Licenses issued under this section may be revoked by the commissioner or his duly constituted agent for cause and after hearing.

Sec. 132-C. Penalty. Whoever violates sections 132-A and 132-B shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$500, or by imprisonment for not over 90 days, or by both.'
