AN ACT Regulating Poultry Service Personnel.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 32, §§ 48-P-1 to 48-P-3, additional. Chapter 32 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding 3 new sections 48-P-1 to 48-P-3, to read as follows:

'Service Personnel.

Sec. 48-P-1. Definition. "Serviceman" means a person or persons who perform such services for poultry as vaccinating, debeaking, diagnosing for disease, prescribing medication or rendering other services, except State and federal personnel, licensed veterinarians and persons employed for this work exclusively in the flocks of their employer.

Sec. 48-P-2. License. No person shall act as a serviceman without having first obtained an annual license from the Division of Animal Industry, the fee for which shall be \$2. Each serviceman shall comply with the rules and regulations made by the commissioner for the conduct of such servicemen as to personal sanitation, reporting of the use of vaccine, or other poultry disease measures, or services. Licenses issued under this section may be revoked by the commissioner or his duly constituted agent for cause and after hearing.

Sec. 48-P-3. Penalty. Whoever violates sections 48-P-1 to 48-P-2 shall be punished by a fine or imprisonment as provided in section 49-G.'
