AN ACT Relating to Tuition for Students Attending Secondary Schools Outside
the State

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 41, § 108, amended. The last sentence of the first paragraph of section 108 of chapter 41 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 62 of chapter 364 of the public laws of 1957, is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

‘Any administrative unit not maintaining a high school may pay tuition, not exceeding the average cost per pupil in all secondary schools of the State of Maine for the preceding year, for any student who with parents or guardians resides in said administrative unit and who attends an approved school of secondary grade in another state; or for any student who attends an approved school of secondary grade in another state when said school specializes in the correction of physical defects and when by reason of a physical disability the individual requires a specialized type of training available in said school but not obtainable in any approved secondary school in the State of Maine.’
