HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 980, L.D. 1367, Bill, "An Act
Relating to Hunting and Fishing Licenses to Canadian
Soldiers Stationed in Maine."

Amend said Bill by inserting before the enacting clause
the following emergency preamble.

'Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts of the Legislature do
not become effective for 90 days after adjournment unless
enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, it is in the best interest of the welfare of the
people of the State of Maine to promote harmony and cordial
relationships with Canada, our neighbor to the north; and

Whereas, one of the ways to promote such relationships
is to treat with courtesy Canadian soldiers temporarily
stationed in Maine; and

Whereas, the following legislation is vitally necessary
to permit such Canadian soldiers to hunt or fish in Maine; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts
create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of
Maine, and require the following legislation as immediately
necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health
and safety; now, therefore,'

Further amend said Bill by adding at the end the following
emergency clause.

'Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the
preamble, this act shall take effect when approved.'
