STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Disturbing Traps of Another.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 37, § 71, amended. The last paragraph of section 71 of chapter 37 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, is amended to read as follows:

'It shall be unlawful for any person, other than a law enforcement officer in the line of duty, to disturb in any manner, any trap other than his own or take to remove any fur-bearing animal from any trap other than his own without the consent of the owner of such trap.'
