AN ACT Permitting Indians to Bring Action for Money Due.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 25, § 329, amended. Section 329 of chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

'**Sec. 329. Indian may sue in his name.** ~~The Commissioner~~ **Any Indian** may, in his own name and capacity, maintain actions for money due to any Indians, and for injuries done to them or their property; ~~and all.~~ **All** sums or damages so recovered shall be distributed to the Indians of the tribe, according to their usages, or be invested in useful articles.'
