## STATE OF MAINE

#### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE

#### AN ACT to Clarify Definition of "Class A Restaurant" under Liquor Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., c. 61, § 1, amended.** The last sentence of that part of section 1 of chapter 61 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 340 of the public laws of 1959, which defines "Class A restaurant" is amended to read as follows:

'In the case of new original licenses the commission shall be authorized to exercise its judgment in respect to its probable qualifications with the provisions of this paragraph, an applicant which has been established and operating for one year or more, if a year round applicant, or for 6 months if a part-time applicant, the commission is authorized to exercise its judgment in respect to the applicant's probable qualifications during the time of the applicant's first license with this paragraph where the applicant in the first instance substantially meets the requirements of this paragraph and the commission is specifically authorized to make such rules and regulations as they deem necessary for carrying out this paragraph.'
