HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to H. P. 1115, L. D. 1537, Bill, "An Act Revising Minimum Wage Law."

Amend said Bill in section 7 by striking out all of that part designated " \underline{I} " and inserting in place thereof the following:

" I. Examination of records, books, etc. Every employer subject to sections 132-A to 132-J shall keep a true and accurate record of the hours worked by each employee and of the wages paid; and the The commissioner or his authorized representative may, and upon written complaint setting forth the violation of section 132-C, shall have-authority-to enter the place of business or employment of any employer or employees in the State, as defined in section 132-B, for the purpose of examining and inspecting any-or-all-books; -registers; -payrolls-and-other such records of-any-such-employer-that-in-any way-relate-to-or-have-a-bearing-upon-the-question-of-wages; hours-and-other-conditions-of-employment-of-any-such-empleyees; and copy any or all of such beeks,-registers,-payrells and-ether records as he or his authorized representative may deem necessary or appropriate; -and-question-such-employees-inthe-presence-of-the-employer-or-his-authorized-agent-for-the purpose-of-aseertaining-whether-sections-132-A-to-132-J-have been-and-are-being-eemplied-with. Any and all information so received shall be considered as confidential and shall not be divulged to any other person or agency except insofar as may be necessary for the enforcement of sections 132-A to 132-J.'"
