SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to H. P. 1123, L. D. 1547, Bill, "An Act
Permitting Governor of Penobscot Tribe of Indians to Bring
Action for Money Due."

Amend said Bill by striking out all of the title and inserting
in place thereof the following title: 'An Act Permitting Attorney
General to Bring Action for Money Due Indian Tribes.'

Further amend said Bill by striking out everything after the
enacting clause and inserting in place thereof the following:

"R. S., c. 25, §329, repealed and replaced. Section 329 of
chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes is repealed and the following
enacted in place thereof:

'Sec. 329. Attorney General may bring action in name of tribe.
The Attorney General upon his own initiative, or at the request of
the governing body of any of the Indian tribes in this State, may
in the name of any such tribe and in his said capacity, maintain
actions for money due any such tribe and for injuries done to
tribal lands. All sums or damages so recovered shall be distributed
by the commissioner to the Indians of the tribe concerned according
to their usages, or be invested in useful articles. This section
shall apply only to tribal and unassigned lands not privately
owned.' "
