AN ACT Providing Access Roads to Recreational Areas.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 23, § 57-A, additional. Chapter 23 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 57-A, to read as follows:

'Access Roads to Recreational Areas.

Sec. 57-A. Access roads to recreational areas. When the officers of a municipality or the owners of a recreational area, including ski areas, deem it necessary that a road be constructed to provide access to a recreational area, they may petition the State Highway Commission for the construction of such road.

The cost of constructing such access road shall be as follows: 50% from the General Highway Fund, 25% from the municipality and 25% from the owners of the recreational area involved.

The State Highway Commission shall have supervision of all construction work on such access road.

The municipality is authorized to appropriate or cause to be raised by taxation or otherwise in such municipality sums sufficient to carry out this section.

Funds from the General Highway Fund for the purposes of this section shall become available only when the funds from the owners of the recreational area and the municipal funds are available.'
