COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P.6, L.D.6, Bill, "AN ACT Relating to Sunday Sales of Liquor by Hotels and Class A Restaurants."

Amend said Bill in section 2 in the 8th line, by inserting after the underlined words "1 P.M. and 9 P.M." the following underlined words 'according to the prevailing time in the State as shown in chapter 1, section 4'

Further amend said Bill by inserting at the end thereof the following new sections:

- Sec. 3. R.S., c. 61 § 2, amended. Section 2 of Chapter 61 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended, by adding before the 8th paragraph from the end the following underlined new subsection:
- 'X. Shall licenses be granted in this city or town for the sale herein of wine, spirits, and malt liquor to be consumed on the premises of hotels and class A restaurants?'
- Sec. 4. R.S., c. 61, § 2, amended. Section 2 of Chapter 61 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended to read as follows in the 4th and 5th paragraphs from the end:
- 'If a majority of the votes cast in any municipality in answer to questions VI, VIII, ex IX, or X is in the affirmative, the ballots for that municipality at the next biennial general election shall carry such question or questions without petition.'

'If a majority of the votes cast in any municipality in answer to questions VI, VIII, or IX, or X is in the negative, the ballots for that municipality at the next biennial general election shall carry such question or questions only after the petition required by this section.'
