SENATE AMENDMENT "C" to S. P. 6, L. D. 6, Bill, "An Act Relating to
Sunday Sales of Liquor by Hotels and Class A. Restaurants."

Amend said Bill in the 8th line of section 2 by inserting after the underlined figure and letters "9 P. M." the underlined words 'according to the time then prevailing in the State'; and by inserting after the underlined word "sold" the underlined words 'only in the dining rooms of said hotels or class A restaurants and'

Further amend said Bill by adding the following new sections:

"Sec. 3. R. S., c. 61, §27, amended. The 4th sentence of section 27 of chapter 61 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

'No licensee shall permit the consumption of liquors on his premises ~~on-Sundays-or~~ after 15 minutes past the hours prohibited for sale thereof, except by bona fide guests in their rooms.'

Sec. 4. R. S., c. 61, §27, amended. The 6th sentence of section 27 of chapter 61 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 2 of chapter 403 of the public laws of 1955, is amended to read as follows: 'The hours of selling or delivering above referred to shall be United States Eastern Standard Time, except as otherwise provided.'

Sec. 5. R. S., c. 61, §27, amended. The first sentence of the 2nd paragraph of section 27 of chapter 61 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

'Any licensee by himself, clerk, servant or agent who sells liquor on Sunday except as otherwise provided shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$100 nor more than \$500, and costs, and a penalty of not less than 2 months nor more than 6 months, in jail, at the discretion of the court; and in default of fine and costs an additional penalty by imprisonment for 6 months.'

Sec. 6. R. S., c. 61, §2, sub-II-B, additional. Section 2 of chapter 61 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended by adding a new subsection II-B, to read as follows:

'II-B. Shall Sunday sales of liquor by hotels and class A restaurants be permitted in this city or town?' "
