STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Sunday Sales of Liquor by Hotels and Class A Restaurants.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. R. S., c. 61, § 27, amended. The first sentence of section 27 of chapter 61 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter 311 of the public laws of 1959, is further amended to read as follows:
- 'No liquor shall be sold in this State on Sundays and no licensee by himself, clerk, servant or agent shall between the hours of midnight and 6 A.M. sell or deliver any liquors, except no liquors shall be sold or delivered on Saturdays after 11:45 P.M.'
- Sec. 2. R. S., c. 61, § 27, amended. The first paragraph of section 27 of chapter 61 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended by inserting after the 2nd sentence a new sentence to read as follows:
- 'No liquor shall be sold in this State on Sundays, except that, subject to all the other provisions of this chapter, licensed hotels and class A restaurants may sell liquor on Sundays between the hours of 1 P.M. and 9 P.M., provided such liquor is sold only with food for which the purchaser is charged a total of \$1 or more per person.'
