### **RESOLVE, Providing Industrial Accident Payments to Mrs. Jeanne T. Smith of Thomaston.**

---

**Mrs. Jeanne T. Smith; industrial accident payments. Resolved:** That there is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund to the State Board of Barbers the sum of \$10,062 to be paid at the rate of \$39 per week, beginning July 1, 1963 for 258 weeks, to Mrs. Jeanne Turner Smith of Thomaston as a full and final settlement for industrial accident payments for the fatal accident, on September 5, 1962, to her husband, William T. Smith, who at the time was Executive Secretary of the State Board of Barbers.

### STATEMENT OF FACTS

Mr. William T. Smith, Jr., Executive Secretary of the State Board of Barbers, was fatally injured as a result of an automobile accident on September 5, 1962. The Industrial Accident Commission has issued a decree dated September 24, 1962, granting compensation to the widow, Mrs. Jeanne Turner Smith, for 300 weeks at \$39 per week, totaling \$11,700. In addition, R. S., c. 31, § 16 grants reasonable burial expenses, not to exceed \$450. The total is therefore \$12,150. The Executive Council authorized the payment of \$2,088, such payments to be made until June 30, 1963. There is, therefore, a balance of \$10,062 to which Mrs. Smith is entitled. The purpose of this resolve is to continue the payment of \$39 per week from July 1, 1963 to the full completion of the 300-week period.
