IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SIXTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Number of Catch of Fish in Certain Waters in Aroostook County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 37, § 45, amended. The first paragraph of section 45 of chapter 37 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, is amended to read as follows:

‘No person shall take, catch, kill or have in possession more than 10 fish of the salmon, trout, togue or black bass species during any one day of any open season, from any or all of the rivers, streams, brooks, lakes and ponds of the State, except as provided for by rules and regulations of the department under section 9, and except that the limit from the Allagash, St. John River and Fish River, and their tributaries, in Aroostook County, shall be 15 fish.’
