AN ACT Providing Free Hunting and Fishing Licenses for Disabled Veterans.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 37, § 39, sub-§ XII-E, additional. Section 39 of chapter 37 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, is amended by adding a new subsection XII-E, to read as follows:

'XII-E. Licenses for disabled veterans. A license to hunt or fish shall be issued without any charge or fee to any resident of Maine who served in World Wars I or II or the Korean Campaign and is receiving retirement pay or compensation or vocational training from the United States Government on account of disability incurred in or aggravated by service in said wars.'
