STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SIXTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Mandatory Jail Sentence in Night Hunting Cases.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

R. S., c. 37, § 77, amended. The last sentence of section 77 of chapter 37 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, is amended to read as follows :

'Any person convicted of a violation under this section shall be punished for the first offense by a fine of not less than \$200 and costs nor more than \$400 and costs, **and 10 days in jail**, which fine, ~~and~~ costs **and jail sentence** shall not be suspended, and an additional penalty of not more than 30 days in jail, at the discretion of the court; and for a 2nd or subsequent offense, by a fine of not less than \$400 and costs nor more than \$800 and costs, and 30 days in jail, which fine, costs and jail sentence shall not be suspended, and an additional penalty of not more than 60 days in jail, at the discretion of the court.'
