## STATE OF MAINE

#### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE

#### AN ACT Relating to Petition for Review of Incapacity Under Workmen's Compensation Act.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., c. 31, § 38, amended.** The 2nd sentence of section 38 of chapter 31 of the Revised Statutes, as last repealed and replaced by section 91 of chapter 417 of the public laws of 1961, is amended to read as follows:

'Pending a hearing and final decision upon such petition for review, and except in such cases as the employer and employee may reach a new agreement under section 32, the payment of compensation shall not be decreased or suspended unless and until a certificate of the employer or his insurance carrier is filed with the commission stating that the employee has left the State or that his present whereabouts are unknown, or that he has resumed work, or that he has refused to submit to a medical examination, or unless a certificate of a physician or surgeon is filed with the commission stating that in his opinion from a current examination the employee is able to resume work in the State of Maine at his usual or customary trade, occupation, profession or business.'
