HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 51, L.D. 101, Bill, "An Act Relating to Issuing of Bonds by School Administrative Districts."

Amend said Bill, in the Title, by striking out the word "Districts" and inserting in place thereof the words and figure 'District No. 15'.

Further amend said Bill by striking out, in the 2nd line, the words "Districts are" and inserting in place thereof the words and figure 'District No. 15 is'

Further amend said Bill by striking out, in the 7th line, the word "Districts" and inserting in place thereof the words and figure 'District No. 15'; and by striking out, in the 8th line, the word "their" and inserting in place thereof the word 'its'

Further amend said Bill by striking out, in the 12th line, the word "the"; and by striking out in said 12th line the word "Districts" and inserting in place thereof the words and figure 'District No. 15'

Further amend said Bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause, except the emergency clause, and inserting in place thereof the following:

'Issuing of bonds by School Administrative District No. 15.

Notwithstanding any other provision of law, each issue of bonds for capital outlay purposes for School Administrative District No.15,

Gray and New Gloucester, shall mature in such annual installments as shall be determined by the Board of School Directors, so that the first installment shall be payable not later than 2 years after the date of issue and the last installment not later than 25 years from the date thereof.'
