STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE

AN ACT Permitting Motels to Sell Liquor.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. R. S., c. 61, § 1, amended. Section 1 of chapter 61 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended by adding after the paragraph which defines "Malt liquors" the following new paragraph:
- "Motel" shall mean a group of furnished cabins or attached cottages near a highway that offers accommodation to tourists. The licensed premises may contain seating accommodations in number no greater than the number of sleeping accommodations.
- Sec. 2. R. S., c. 61, § 2, amended. Section 2 of chapter 61 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended by adding a new subsection II-B to read as follows:
 - 'II-B. Shall licenses be granted in this city or town for sale herein of spirits to be consumed on the premises of motels?'
- Sec. 3. R. S., c. 61, § 31, amended. Section 31 of chapter 61 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended by adding after the 7th paragraph a new paragraph to read as follows:

'Motels — Spirituous \$300.00'

Sec. 4. R. S., c. 61, § 31, amended. Section 31 of chapter 61 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended by adding after the 18th paragraph a new paragraph to read as follows:

'Part-time — Motel — Spirituous \$200.00'
