IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE

#### AN ACT Prohibiting Certain Activity at Voting Places.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 3-A, § 92, sub-§ III, amended. Subsection III of section 92 of chapter 3-A of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section I of chapter 360 of the public laws of 1961 is amended to read as follows:

'III. Advertising prohibited. A person shall not display any advertising material or operate any advertising medium intended to influence the opinion of any voter, within 250 feet of the entrance to the voting place; nor shall any person display any advertising material or operate any advertising medium during any primary election or municipal caucus intended to influence any voter to vote for 2 or more candidates in such primary election or municipal caucus as a block or group, within 1,000 feet of the entrance to the voting place.'
