STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Closed Season on Scallops in Bagaduce River.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1959, c. 154, c. C, § 1, repealed. Section 1 of chapter C of chapter 154 of the private and special laws of 1959, is repealed as follows:

'See. 1. Taking scallops in Bagaduce River; penalty. In addition to the closed season provided for scallops under the Revised Statutes of 1954, chapter 37 A, there is a closed season on scallops in the waters of the Bagaduce River to a point at the mouth of said river marked by a line extending from Dice's Head in Castine through the southernmost point of Nautilus Island to the Brooksville shore, from the first day of November to the 31st day of the following December of each year. During that period it is unlawful to take or to fish for any scallops in that area, and it is unlawful to possess any scallops which were taken from that area during that period

Whoever violates any provision of this section shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$10 nor more than \$300, or by imprisonment for not more than 90 days, or by both, and in addition by a fine of \$5 for every 100 seallops or part thereof involved'
