STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Certain Per Diem Fees of Deputy Sheriffs.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. R. S., c. 89, § 150, sub-§ XIV, amended. Subsection XIV of section 150 of chapter 89 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 1 of chapter 328 of the public laws of 1959, is further amended to read as follows:
 - 'XIV. Attending court and keeping prisoner. For attending court and keeping the prisoner in criminal cases, \$11 \$12 a day, and in that proportion for a greater or shorter length of time.'
- Sec. 2. R. S., c. 89, § 150, sub-§ XVI, amended. Subsection XVI of section 150 of chapter 89 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended to read as follows:
 - 'XVI. Special duties. Every deputy sheriff while performing special duties under order of the sheriff shall receive for such services \$11 a day, together with necessary, incidental expenses, to be paid from the county treasury, the bills for which shall be audited as provided in chapter 150, section 2. Such officers shall not be entitled to fees for any services rendered in criminal matters while acting as per diem officers. A chief deputy performing similar special duties shall receive an additional \$1 per day.'
