STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SIXTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to the Beginning of Standard Time.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 1, § 4, amended. The last paragraph of section 4 of chapter 1 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 403 of the public laws of 1955, is amended to read as follows:

‘At 2 o’clock ante-meridian of the last Sunday in ~~April~~ **February** of each year, the standard time in this State shall be advanced one hour, and at 2 o’clock ante-meridian of the last Sunday in October of each year the standard time in this State, by the retarding of one hour, shall be made to coincide with the mean astronomical time of the degree of longitude governing the zone wherein the State is situated, the standard official time of which is described as United States Eastern Standard Time, so that between the last Sunday of ~~April~~ **February** at 2 o’clock ante-meridian and the last Sunday in October at 2 o’clock ante-meridian in each year the standard time in this State shall be one hour in advance of the United States Eastern Standard Time and said time shall be known as “Eastern Daylight Time.”’
