**RESOLVE, Providing Funds for Public Landing at Islesford, Hancock County.**

---

**Public landing at Islesford, Hancock County; appropriation for. Resolved:** That there is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund to the Town of Cranberry Isles, Hancock County, the sum of \$35,000 to aid said town to construct a public town landing at Islesford. Such appropriation shall not be available until the amount of \$15,000 has been appropriated by the Town of Cranberry Isles for the same purpose.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The proposed town landing as shown on sketch prepared by Acadia National Park office in Bar Harbor is estimated to cost \$50,000 of which the town can provide \$15,000 under state aid program and own funds.

There is no town landing at the present time, the one in use is a deteriorating private landing owned by Elmer Spurling.

The pier and approach would be over land of Acadia National Park which has agreed to lease under regular park multiple year free lease.

The sketch shows proposed breakwater not at present contemplated because of cost, but pier and landing itself would be solid and act as a breakwater as far as it extends.

The stone from one of the 3 existing piers is to be used to rebuild other 2. Additional stone is available from the park at Winter Harbor. It would be necessary to purchase the balance of the stone and grout.
