STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE

RESOLVE, Granting World War I Bonus to Albert C. Lorentzen of Portland.

World War I bonus of \$100; granted to Albert C. Lorentzen. Resolved: That there is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$100 to be paid to Albert C. Lorentzen of Portland as his World War I bonus.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The records at the Adjutant General's office pertaining to World War I bonuses show that application for the bonus of Albert C. Lorentzen was received on January 19, 1921 and that check No. 7494 was issued to him on January 26, 1921 and mailed to him at 28 Hanover Street, Portland. There is also a notation in the records to the effect that a letter was returned unclaimed on November 23, 1922. Since the World War I bonus has long since expired the only solution is for Mr. Lorentzen to put in a resolve through his Representative to Legislature to get this money.
